





Weber's Invitation to the Dance begins with quiet courtesy, but in Berlioz's glittering orchestration whirls you off your feet. Brahms starts his Piano Quartet with three movements of mellow emotion - before suddenly cutting loose in a wild, crazy folk-dance. Schoenberg loved this piece, and his uproariously entertaining orchestral version doesn't stint on either colour or panache. Distinguished German cellist Johannes Moser performs Schumann's ardent Cello Concerto.
